Rubbish Counting

You can be part of a citizen science project. Tearfund is joining with other organisations to look at the amount of plastic waste that passes through our houses. It's simple. You download a form from the internet https://thebigplasticcount.com/sign-up? and for the week 11-17 March you log all the plastic rubbish that is heading towards your bin, your recycling boxes or to Terracycle. You send the results of your count to Tearfund the data is put together giving a really good picture of how much plastic waste and of what types are coming out of our homes. Plastic is getting everywhere and we need to reduce it to keep creation safe. Will you take part?
